## Against the Wind Festival, November 11-17, Arcata Playhouse, Schedule of Events

Monday, November 11, Veteran's Day: "Seeking Peace." An evening developed around veteran issues (possible topics: sanctions, a pretext to war; US overseas bases = 800 in 177 countries; military budget and defense spending, 2.1 military actively deployed at cost of \$850K-1.2 million/soldier/yr.; privatization of VA; nexus between nuclear power and nuclear weapons; HSU veterans programs; GI Rights Hotline. Partcipants: Eric Hollenbeck (Viet Nam war vet, owner of Blue Ox Millworks, poet); Helen Jaccard or Gerry Condon, representing anti-nuclear, peace boat, "Golden Rule" and VFP; Bob Gould, M.D., President, San Francisco Bay Area Chapter, Physicians for Social Responsibility; Ehren Tool (Gulf War veteran, ceramicist), Paul Chappell (West Point graduate, Iraq war veteran, Capt. US Army, Nuclear Age Peace Foundation Peace Literacy Project; and others

**Tuesday, November 12:** Students Spoken Word. High school, college age, and young adults presenting original works of poetry, dramatic reading, video, drama, and other student-created work

**Wednesday, November 13:** Panel Discussion organized by Peter Alstone, HSU Schatz Energy Center, presenting the science behind climate change/global warming and the solutions. Special emphasis on local initiatives – wind energy and micro-solar grids. The role of nuclear energy in solving the climate crisis will be presented.

**Thursday, November 14:** "Nuclear Jeopardy": game night based on College Board format, with 4 teams of 4 members. Questions will focus on defense spending, nuclear arms, climate change. Topics will be introduced. Teams will be scored on time to the answer.

**Friday, November 15, and Saturday, November 16:** "Songs of Freedom": US protest songs performed by local bands with local artists. The program will be curated with each song briefly introduced and placed historically. Jim Hubbard is coordinating this program

**Sunday, November 17:** Honoring Edie and Bryan Jessup of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship for their work in this community promoting social justice, combating racism, advocating for a peaceful world free from war and nuclear weapons.
